



MANUFACTURING

If you enjoy working with high-tech tools, operating machinery, or building things, then a career in manufacturing may be for you.



Welder, Cutter, Solderer, & Brazer

Use hand-welding, flame-cutting, hand soldering, or brazing equipment to weld or join metal components or to fill holes, indentations, or seams of fabricated metal products.



Electrical Engineer

Research, design, develop, test, or supervise the manufacturing and installation of electrical equipment, components, or systems for commercial, industrial, military, or scientific use.



Team Assembler

Work as part of a team having responsibility for assembling an entire product or component of a product. Team assemblers can perform all tasks conducted by the team in the assembly process and rotate through all or most of them rather than being assigned to a specific task on a permanent





Production Helper

Help production workers by performing duties, such as supplying or holding materials or tools, and cleaning work area and equipment.



Cabinetmaker & Bench Carpenter

Cut, shape, and assemble wooden articles or set up and operate a variety of woodworking machines, such as power saws, jointers, and mortisers to surface, cut, or shape lumber or to fabricate parts for wood products.



Machinist

Use machine tools, such as lathes, milling machines, and grinders, to produce precision metal parts.



Use computer numerically controlled (CNC) machines to produce a wide variety of products, from automobile engines to computer keyboards. CNC machines operate by reading the code included in a computer-controlled module, which drives the machine tool and performs the functions of forming and shaping a part formerly done by machine operators.



Industrial Engineer

Design, develop, test and evaluate integrated systems for managing industrial production processes.



Industrial Production Manager

Plan, direct, and coordinate all the people and equipment involved in the manufacturing process.
